Staff Senate Minutes

Thursday, January 8, 2015

Call to Order:

Meeting was called to order at 3:10 p.m. by Chair Mary Schiller.

Guest Speaker: Deb Garfi, Director of Parking and Transportation

East Campus Parking Director duties include: find a place for people to find parking and also promote walking on campus. Parking is not free; no STATE funds are allotted so parking must be self-supporting, and 80% of ticket revenue generated is returned to the State of North Carolina for public education. Parking and Transportation keep the permit revenue. See page 4-7.

Construction of a 700 space parking garage and student center will affect 450 parking spaces. The current average use is not full. Parking for A1 spaces is available at other campus locations near Christenbury gym, behind Erwin, certain parking meters can be used by A permit. 10th and Cotanche will change to A1 permits and B permits will move out one more block to 10th and Evans. Upon completion of the project, the East Campus will gain 125 parking spaces. Growing pains are expected; Dept. of Parking and Transportation will deliver service as best as possible. Parking and Transportation does not expect parking fees to increase when the parking deck is complete; however, the garage permit may be more expensive.

Visitors and after hours parkers should pay to park at meters. Departments that organize events can choose to pay for parking passes for attendees. For large scale events the parking fees should be built into the ticket price. Graduation ceremony parkers would be exempt from parking fees.

ANNUAL REPORT TO STAFF SENATE

PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

January 2015

The Department of Parking and Transportation Services (P&T) reports to the Division of Administration and Finance. It consists of the following areas: parking lot inventory management and enforcement, parking permit sales, finance and administration, motor pool management, special events coordination, and transportation demand management (TDM). Transportation demand management utilizes alternative transportation to minimize parking demand and traffic congestion and includes ECU Transit, bicycles, pedestrian, carshare and rideshare.

Parking is required by NC law to be self-supporting. We receive no state funding. Our primary goal is to keep permit fees as low as possible and base fees on paying for convenience. To continue in the maintenance and upgrade of existing parking resources and to plan for future parking demand, we are researching additional avenues for revenue. We have initiated parking fees to all who utilize parking on the ECU campus and lease fees to outside groups to meet the future needs of ECU. Because of this, we have not increased the permit fees for the last 4 years. For example, Athletics now pays to lease parking spaces for athletic events and we have entered into short term leases for access to specific or unused parking areas. These include a Verizon cellular unit and use of an offsite parking area by Miller-Motte.

Parking Inventory

There are currently 12,625 parking spaces that are located on and off campus. These spaces include permit, ADA, service, visitor, and patient parking spaces. The number of available permit parking spaces is 10,654. These spaces need to satisfy parking demands of 28,380 faculty, staff, and students. The spaces by location are as follows:

Parking Improvements

- Developed an additional 100 student parking spaces on College Hill after losing 265 parking spaces to the Belk Construction Project.
- Increased participation in the Alternative Transportation Programs by 100%. (Car, Ride, and Bike Share)
- Named Bicycle Friendly Campus by League of American Bicyclists. ECU received Silver Designation, one of two schools in North Carolina
- Kept Parking Permit Fees stable for the last 4 years by increasing alternative revenue sources, including Pay-By-Space stations on perimeter of campus to replace meters.
- Continued to supply operating funds to Transit and ECU Police to insure safety and decreasing parking demand.
- Continued to improve the Event Parking Experience on campus with University Event Planning Group.

Upcoming Parking Projects

- Constructing of Parking Garage at new Student Center and developing parking policies and procedures.
- Research and recommend Revenue and Access Control equipment for Garage.
- Installing additional multi-space meters across campus to improve customer service and increase revenue.
- Developing existing parking lot at 10th and Evans to increase parking spaces and improve lot.
- Continuing to work with Facilities Services on the further development of the Core Campus Pedestrian Zone
- Installing additional Bicycle resources on campus including covered bike racks, dedicated bike lanes, and repair stations.
